



Enabling people to stay in their homes despite conflict

Dear Friend.

I am in awe of the communities and our volunteers in Darfur. Even while they have been worried about their own families, they have been doing all they can to help children in our villages. Over the past months, they have carried food, medicines and more, to over 100,000 children. And they are not stopping.

This is the miracle of Kids for Kids. Whilst the rest of the world wrings its hands at the seeming impossibility of helping in any way at all in Sudan; where the two warring parties give no believable signs of wanting peace; where other countries' greed for gold and power outstrips their humanity; our quiet determination to help one child at a time has enabled us to find ways to get funds to our volunteers, and for them to ensure it is transformed into life saving aid, from food, to harvests, to health care.

It does not stop there – the years of unceasing violence and government surveillance have made me determined to extend as much help as we can and also to protect, as far as possible, everyone who helps us. We have been providing mosquito nets for years to as many villages as we can. But it must have been challenging for the communities, our Darfurian volunteers and team when I said I would not agree to providing for this desperate need unless we had the name of every single beneficiary. How much easier to provide a truck load to a village leader and for him to select the families – but we have been wrongly accused in the past of our funds being diverted into the purchasing of arms – and the deadly risk that accusation could be to anyone helping Kids for Kids. It took time but I now have the 1700 names of every mother who has a mosquito net for her children. Just imagine: a mother who had no hope of buying anything like a net – however much she dreaded hearing the whine of a mosquito, which carries not only the risk of malaria, but also yellow fever, chikungunya and dengue fever – now she can give protection to her little ones.

Here in the UK, there have been problems too – we had high hopes that we would be able to appoint a CEO this summer to take over the administration and fundraising which I have done for so long, but we now start the search again. If you have read my Chairman's Report for our recent Annual Accounts you will know that, like so many others in this country, we have suffered a **cyber attack**. We had lost our database. I am pleased to say, thanks to two of the most incredible volunteers, we have managed to reconstruct all of our data, and nothing has been lost. But it has taken a lot of time and worry.

We provide all the tackle if you need it, plus volunteers join me to make sure you are well fed from first light to dusk! For both beginners and seasoned fishermen this is a real treat. Do come!
